Dance Gap Year Code of Conduct

In today's climate, there are certain precautions we must take before accepting participants into the program. In respect of Health & Safety regulations and insurance, the following rules of behaviour and conduct must be understood and adhered to during your Dance Gap Year.

Code of Conduct

- Participants must act respectfully towards oneself, fellow participants, independent educators, DGY staff and their surroundings/environment.
- Be responsible for yourself and your belongings.
- Be willing and able to follow the program schedule.
- Maintain an open line of communication with DGY staff.
- Participants are to communicate professionally and constructively, whether in person or virtually, handling dissent or disagreement with courtesy, dignity and an open mind.
- Participants are expected to be respectful regarding feedback & open to alternative perspectives and points of view.
- According to the country's law in which the participant resides, consumption of alcohol is permitted for participants of legal age. Abuse of alcohol that ends in the need of medical attention is grounds for termination of the program without a refund.
- Drug taking, unless for medical reasons, is not permitted. Participants found consuming drugs is grounds for termination of the program without a refund.
- Overnight guests must be arranged accordingly, and must follow the rules of the housing host.
- Dance Gap Year and its partnering organizations do not accept responsibility for the security of personal belongings such as electronics (phones, cameras, tablets, computers, etc.) or any other personal possessions.
- Prejudice, racist or sexist language and imagery used to imply distaste or hate are not appropriate for any conference venue, including talks, workshops, events, and social media. Participants are prohibited from the use of language, images, activities, or other material in this manner.

Please be aware that at certain times, participants will not be under the direct supervision of a DGY staff member. While in visiting countries, participants will carry an ID and a copy of emergency contact information at all times.

It is in the interest of your health & safety that the above code of conduct is respected and adhered by. In the event of a serious behavioural incident, we may deem it is necessary to send you home or implement other appropriate actions. In the event that you are asked to leave the program, you are fully aware and accept that a financial reimbursement for the program or the remaining time is not guaranteed.
